Classical Defense, Closed Variation In the Classical variations, Black's bishop takes up a more passive position at e7 Nevertheless, it is a very solid defense, and Black has the option of capturing White's knight when it gets to e5, because there will not be a fork when White recaptures with the d-pawn

### **Play The Scandinavian - Quality Chess**

Classical Caro-Kann (1e4 c6 2d4 d5 3xc3 dxe4 4axe4 xf5) while having avoided various White divergences on move three, notably the critical Advance Variation and the Panov Attack If Black succeeds in developing his light-squared bishop and then completes his development
