Marcus Garvey espoused a third set of theories on black liberation Garvey’s focus differed from that of Washington and slightly from that of Du Bois’ as he worked toward the liberation of the entire African Diaspora Garvey founded the Universal Negro Improvement Association (UNIA) to work against imperialism and colonialism in Africa
