#### **Historical periods, musical styles, and principal genres ...**

Romantic Era: 1800-1900, or nineteenth-century music aesthetic: freedom from boundaries, including those that separate the arts: music becomes more programmatic, merging with literature, art, and philosophy; programmatic elements reflect this trend;
